‘Challenging the roles children and young people adopt using drama’

What are the roles that children and young people adopt in childhood? How can we challenge these roles when working with children and young people? Using drama techniques this course will equip you with the skills you need to work positively in this area.

This practical and creative workshop will explore the many roles (positive and negative) that children and young people adopt and play, and explore the impact these have on their behaviour. We will consider why they adopt these roles to provide us with an insight into their presenting behaviours. Using drama techniques as a therapeutic tool, we will seek to challenge these pre-existing adapted roles and create new, less destructive ones.

The workshop is designed to build confidence and develop basic drama skills; roleplay, thought tracking, hot seating and moment of truth. Participants will be taken through a programme they can then use when working with their own students.
